
The Contraceptive Ideology.

Contraceptive Ideology requires:

- 1. Contraception works perfectly.
- 2. Contraception is costless, with no negative health, psychological or social consequences
- 3. There are no realistic alternatives to artificial contraception.
- 4. Abortion is available as a back-up, in case of contraceptive failure.
- 5. Abortion is costless, with no negative health, psychological or social consequences.
- 6. There are no realistic alternatives to abortion, for women with unplanned or ill-timed pregnancies.
- 7. And, most important of all, sexual activity is necessary for a happy, healthy and fulfilled life.

Contraceptive Ideology

The separation of sex from babies



- Every person old enough to give meaningful consent is entitled to unlimited sexual activity.
 - Free contraception
 - Free Abortion
 - Pornography

Contraceptive Ideology

- "Free" Means zero cost in every respect
- Reduce all out of pocket costs.
- Minimize inconvenience.
- Deny risks and harms, such as:
 - Post-abortion stress syndrome
 - Abortion- breast cancer link
 - Health risks to contraception
 - Contraceptive failure

Danish Study of 1.3 million women:

- Hormonal contraception risks:
- Risk of strokes, for the most commonly used formulation, comparable to smoking.
- Risk of contraceptive "patch" and "ring" greater than smoking.

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Contraceptive Ideology

- Deny risks and harms of hormonal contraception:
 - Strokes
 - Heart attacks
 - Cancer
 - Glaucoma
 - Depression
 - Decreased libido

Risks associated with abortion

- Immediate risks:
- hemorrhage, infection,
- uterine perforation
- cervical laceration

- Longer term risks in future pregnancies:
 - Placenta previa
 - Cervical incompetence
 - Pelvic Inflammatory disease
- Breast cancer


Other consequences, among the educated:

- Upper end of the economy built around delayed child-bearing
- Decision-makers disproportionately from the childless.
- Wider spacing between generations.
- Delayed maturity



Other consequences, among the lower classes:

- Contraceptive ideology, combined with welfare incentives: marriage has disappeared.
- Multiple-partner fertility.
- Family break-down or non-formation.



Rather:

- A sober-minded look at:
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The Supreme Court's role in disaggregating the family

- Griswold v. Connecticut, 1965.
 - Found a right of marital privacy.
- Eisenstadt v. Baird, 1972
 - Disaggregated the couple
 - "Whatever the rights of the individual to access to contraceptives may be, the rights must be the same for the married and unmarried alike."
- Roe v Wade, 1973

Campaigns leading up to Griswold v Connecticut

- Attempts to repeal the 1879 "Comstock Law" began in 1923
- On one side: wealthy, members of Yale public health, medical school and law faculties.
- (Eventually CBS News, Eric Sevareid referred to the case as "the Yale Project.")
- On the other side, the Catholic Church defending poor immigrants.

Why Griswold v. Connecticut? Why strike down seldom-enforced laws?

- "Their presence made it impossible for the state to encourage contraception, something it now increasingly deems necessary to do. The middle income and the affluent, married and unmarried, use contraceptives. The poor have babies. When the poor, often racial minorities, are on the welfare rolls, taxpaying Americans rebel and expect the state to do something about it."

Why Griswold v. Connecticut? Why strike down seldom-enforced laws?

"The national government already established this policy (ie heavily promoted and subsidized contraception) as part of its program of aid to underdeveloped countries, but the States could hardly follow suit as long as their own laws forbade the practice."

In the background of all this, the shadow of Malthus and Darwin

- Population control and eugenics
- 1959, Draper Commission recommended population control as part of US foreign policy
- Office of Economic Opportunity: birth control funds to states (1965)
- subsidized sterilization of poor in birth control clinics (1971)
- pilot program rural Louisiana, nearly half of the 22,175 women sterilized in 1972 were black.

- Success in the Courts, not in legislatures.

The case of the Philippines: "legal" is never enough.

- Contraception legal since 1966.
- Contraceptive"prevalence rate" = 49% in 2011.
- "Reproductive Health Law" passed in 2012.



Philippine Phertility Phacts

1960

- Total Population= 24 mil
- Total Fertility Rate: 7.15 births/woman
- Infant Mortality = 85 infant deaths/ live birth
- Maternal mortality = 253
 maternal deaths / live births
- Lifespan = 58 years

2010

- Total Pop = 94 million
- TFR= 3.15 births / woman
- Infant mortality= 13 / 1,000 live births
- Maternal mortality = 96
 maternal deaths / live
 births
- Lifespan = 68 years

A pagan ideology that no Christian should have anything to do with.

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
The Sexual Revolution:
